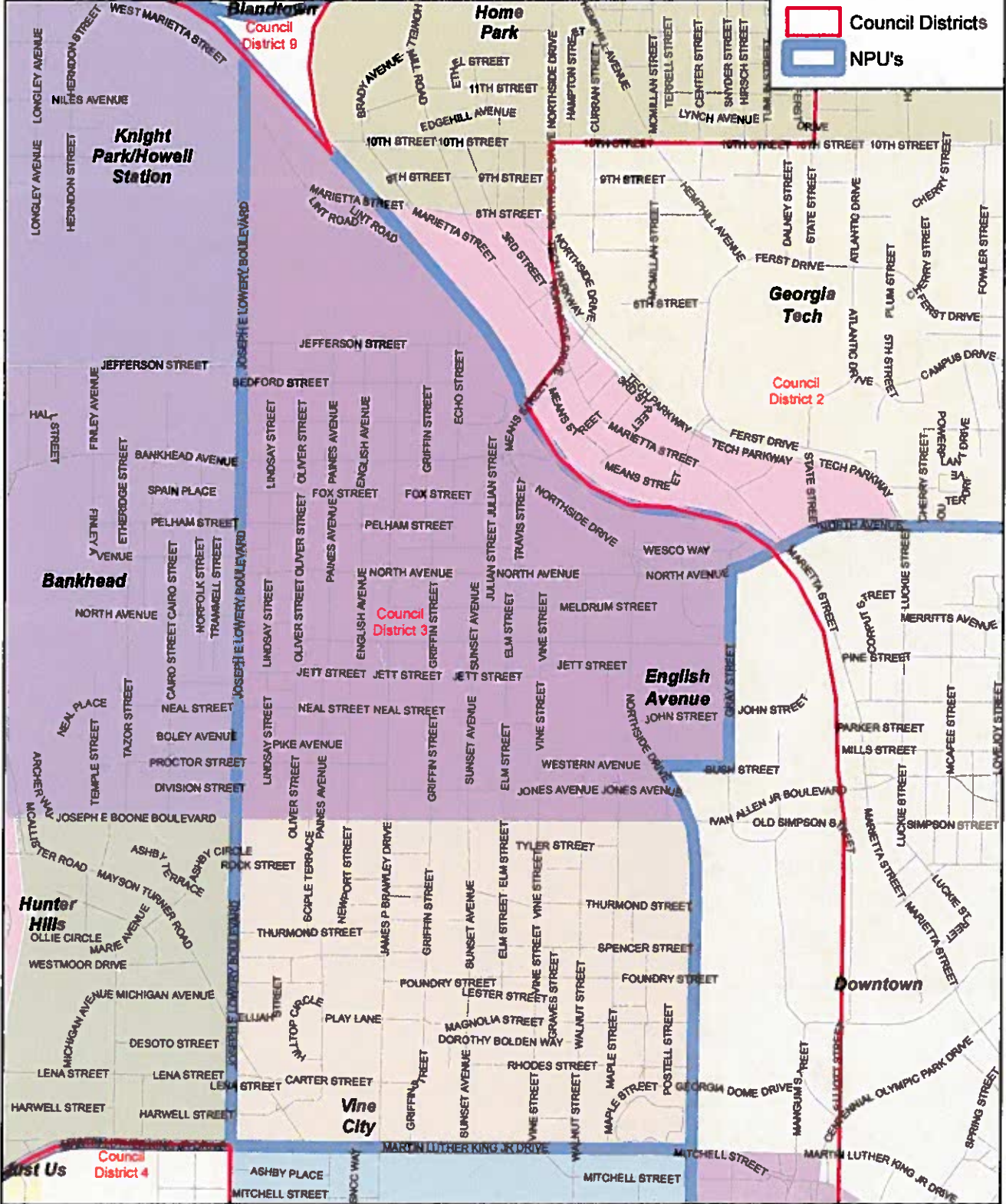



ISSUES

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

Police Foundation	There was a concern that the proposed housing for police officers in NPU L will be all in one place as opposed to scattered throughout the NPU. The NPU expressed concerns about being occupied by the police and that not having more interaction with the NPU does not foster a good relationship. There was concern the proposed location is prim real estate and could be developed for a different purpose. The NPU voted to send a letter to the police foundations with their concerns.
Taste of Soul	There was a request that the merchants association be included more in the planning of the event. There was a question regarding whether the produce of local famers would be used. The NPU voted to support the event.
Z-16-35	There was a question in regards to whether there were any "C" districts in the NPU and whether the proposed legislation would impact the existing SPI districts. The NPU voted to support the legislation.
640 North Avenue (rezoning and land use admendment)	There was a comment that the NPU should support the rezoning and land use admendment becassue it was already part of the neighborhood plan. There was a further comment that the support should not be for the specific project but for support of the recommendations in the neighborhood plan. The NPU voted to support the rezoning and the land use admendment.
Request for a Report from the Police	There was a request that the NPU request a report regarding the effectiveness of the different public safety initiatives in the NPU including cameras. There was a question regarding whether there would come a time when the cameras would be removed or moved to different locations in the NPU. The NPU voted to request the report.
Festival of Lights	The NPU voted to support the Festival of Lights.
